ISBE Professional Development Credits for Illinois High School Instructors

IVCC will email you your ISBE PD credits within a few weeks (after the conference) for the ICAIA High School Instructors that turned in their ISBE Evaluation form on time.

EV Charging Infrastructure

With federal clean energy policies, pledges by automotive companies to transition to zero-emission vehicles, and accelerating consumer demand for electric vehicles (EVs), analysts have projected that by 2030, EVs could account for 30–42 million light-duty vehicles on the road.

The National Renewable Energy Laboratory (NREL) conducted a study to determine what the national charging infrastructure will need to look like to support these projections and released its findings in the recent "The 2030 National Charging Network" report.

Taking into consideration numerous factors such as climate, travel patterns, housing, charging preferences, etc., the study found that to support a mid-adoption scenario of 33 million EVs on the road by 2030, the nation will need 28 million charging ports. Researchers project the national charging infrastructure will require:

- 182,000 publicly accessible fast charging ports to enable long-distance travel and ride-hailing electrification and to support those who lack access to residential charging.
- 1 million Level 2 charging ports at publicly accessible locations—including high-density neighborhoods, office buildings, and retail outlets.
- 26 million Level 1 and Level 2 charging ports at privately accessible locations—including single-family homes, multifamily properties, and workplaces.

By 2030, Illinois is projected to have 1,100,000 Plug-in Electric Vehicles (PEV's) that will need to be supported by the following charging network:

942,200 Private (Level 1 and 2) Charging Infrastructure Ports:

- 893,000 Single family homes with charge ports
- 34,600 Multifamily homes with charge ports
- 14,000 Workplace charge ports

33,000 Public Level 2 Charging Infrastructure Ports:

- 11,000 Neighborhood charge ports
- 5,100 Office space charge ports
- 6,000 Retail space charge ports
- 10,900 Other public space charge ports

5,700 Public Direct Current (DC) Fast Charge Infrastructure Ports:

- 2,000 DC150 kW charge ports
- 2,000 DC250 kW charge ports
- 1,700 DC350 kW charge ports
