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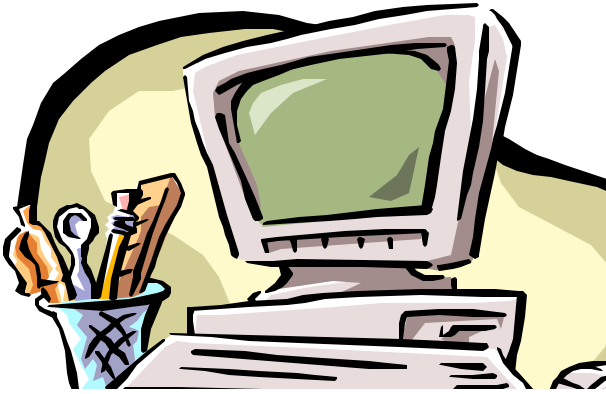

At this conference, ICAIA had 6 members from Wisconsin in attendance (not including Dan O'Connor) and 7 new members joining the Association.

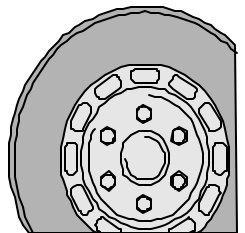
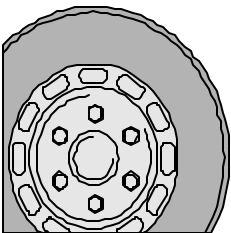

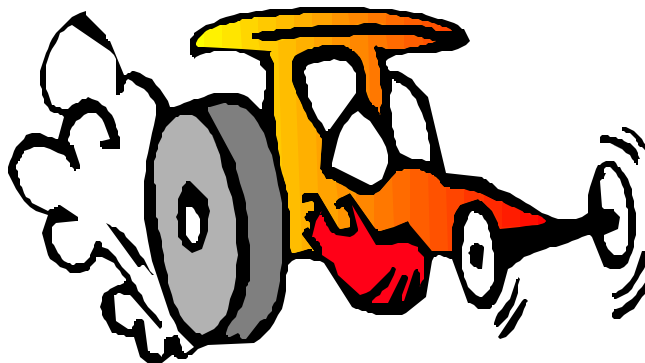
Illinois Automotive Education Motorsports Roundtable

DaimlerChrysler Vehicle to be Donated at ICAIA Conference

DaimlerChrysler has committed to donate a vehicle at the Fall 2003 ICAIA Conference to a members school to be used for training purposes. The recipient school will be selected during the Thursday evening banquet and must be present to win. In order for a school to be eligible to receive the donation from DaimlerChrysler, the school must agree that the vehicle will only be used for training purposes and that it will not be licensed, titled, or driven on any road. In addition, the selected school must be NATEF (ASE) Certified in all 8 areas if a post secondary institution, or 4 areas if a secondary institution. NATEF eligibility will be based upon what NATEF has posted on their website as of October 8, 2003.

The selected schools information will be sent to DaimlerChrysler and they will then handle processing the donation to the school.

Resolving Conflict with Special Needs Adolescents

Jerry Zabin, LCSW will be presenting at the upcoming ICAIA conference on resolving conflict with special needs adolescents. Mr. Zabin has been working in the field of social work since 1976. He received his Bachelor's Degree in Social Work from the University of Wisconsin, Madison. Mr. Zabin received his Master's Degree in Social Work in 1980. He has maintained a psychotherapy practice in Skokie since 1986. Mr. Zabin has also served as the Director of Clinical Services for national Employee Assistance organizations. As the former Director of two addictions programs, Mr. Zabin has a great deal of experience in working with chemical dependency.

A substantial portion of Mr. Zabin's clinical focus is in evaluating and treating men who perpetrate domestic violence. Since he began providing treatment services for Domestic Violence perpetrators in 1991, Mr. Zabin has worked with hundreds of male perpetrators, teaching them alternatives to exerting power and control over others and learning to communicate in non-abusive ways.

Mr. Zabin is on the adjunct faculty of Oakton Community College and is a full-time faculty member of Glenbrook High School District #225, where he works with Special Education students diagnosed with Behavior Disorder. Mr. Zabin has presented over 100 seminars throughout the Metropolitan Chicago area and he has earned a reputation for providing educational and motivational seminars with warmth and humor.

Part of Mr. Zabin's presentation will focus on styles of conflict management and how we can encourage adolescents. Instructors must sometimes deal with student behavior that is unwanted in the classroom. The presentation will allow you to understand why they are acting the way they do and how to handle the situation to best motivate the student.

Ever wonder why some students act the way they do? If you are currently dealing with a student behavior or motivation situation, this presentation is for you. The presentation is also for those new to the profession to understand how to deal with students when the situation does present itself.
