ISBE Professional Development Credits for Illinois High School Instructors

ICAIA will be offering **10 ISBE PD Credits** for Illinois High School Instructors attending both days of the ICAIA conference. These credits will be issued through Illinois Valley Community College (IVCC) which has graciously agreed to provide these PD Credits again.

Illinois high school instructors that need **ISBE PD Credits** should pick up a **ISBE Evaluation form** at the conference registration table on Thursday morning. The form will need to complete and returned to Art Koudelka (ICAIA Executive Treasurer) before leaving on Friday, by 12:15 pm. There will be a drop box at the registration table on Friday morning for your convenience.

If your evaluation form is not returned by Friday 12:15 pm., you will **not** receive ISBE PD Credits for the conference.

IVCC will email you your ISBE PD credits within a few weeks (after the conference) for the ICAIA High School Instructors that turned in their ISBE Evaluation form on time.

FAQ's:

2. <u>I am a one person program. Can I host an ICAIA conference?</u>

YES. ICAIA staff is there to help support you. ICAIA takes care of all the registration details. ICAIA can help with contacting vendors and possible presenters. What the host school needs to do is coordinate lodging, facilities, food vendor, and banquet location. In fact, ICAIA is there to help you with that as well.

- Mateusz Rak: Workforce Education Scholarship


