Illinois Central College is seeking a qualified individual to provide innovative lecture and laboratory instruction for the General Motors- Automotive Educational Program and the Automotive Technology Program. Responsibilities include but are not limited to: providing practical and technical instruction involving demonstration of the NATEF skills required by industry such as automotive electrical systems, automatic transmissions, manual transmissions and drivelines, steering and suspension repair including alignments, brake service and repair, engine repair, automotive HVAC, emissions and drivability; update course syllabi and lessons as technology or practices advance; plan and supervise internships; maintain General Motors training credentials according to the GM ASEP Standards Document; communicate with local employers to keep abreast of employment needs and emerging industry issues and assist with lab setup and the maintenance of equipment. Must be able to work with faculty and staff members in departmental teams, college committees and mentor adjunct instructors. At all times, the instructor is responsible for demonstrating and ensuring that all class participants adhere to all principles of lab safety, to protect personnel and equipment throughout all courses taught.

NECESSARY QUALIFICATIONS

Bachelor's degree in Automotive Technology, Automotive Service Technology, Automotive Power Mechanics or Engine Power Technology with 4000 work hours as an automotive technician; the Automotive Service Excellence (ASE) certification in relevant areas OR Associate degree in Automotive Technology, Automotive Service Technology, Automotive Power Mechanics or Engine Power Technology with 6000 work hours as an automotive technician; the Automotive Service Excellence (ASE) certification in relevant areas OR Technical Certification in Automotive Technology with 10,000 work hours as an automotive technician; General Motors World Class Technician Certification; The Automotive Service Excellence (ASE) certification in relevant areas OR 10 years' work experience as an automotive technician and the Automotive Service Excellence (ASE) certification in the relevant areas.

The physical level of function is Medium, which is defined as lifting 60 pounds max occasionally, and lifting and/or carrying objects weighing 25 pounds max frequently. *Final candidates must successfully complete a physical determining that they meet the physical requirements of the job.*
